Veteran athlete Darren Scott on track for third world sprint record

Runcorn: October 11, 2018: Life, they say, begins at 40 but veteran athlete Darren Scott is setting his sights on a new adage – 'Life begins at 50!'

Darren will reach this birthday milestone on March 7th next year and he plans to celebrate by becoming the world's fastest 200 metres athlete over the age of 50. He already holds the Masters 200 Metres world records for the over 40s and over 45s categories, and next year Darren aims to clinch an unprecedented hat-trick by breaking the over 50's record – making him one of the quickest senior athletes on the planet.

Runcorn-based Darren only took up athletics when he was 21 and quickly became a top-class 200 metres sprinter representing Scotland at international level. But when he turned 35-years-old, he became eligible for Masters' competitions where he literally took the world by storm. He currently holds more than 50 club, UK,



British, European and World titles competing against athletes who in their heyday have graced Olympics' tracks.



The flying Scot is an athletic superman. After taking all the honours available in M40 and M45 sprint racing, he turned his attention to a new discipline, the decathlon. He promptly won the M45 UK Masters Championship in July before finishing fourth in last month's M45 Masters World Athletics competition in Spain.

Now Darren, a fitness instructor at The Heath Business and Technical Park's Leisure Suite in Runcorn, is back in training with his eyes firmly set on taking the M50 200 metres world record in 2019.

He says: "I achieved all I could in the 200 Metres breaking the world records in the M40 category at Birmingham in 2010 and the M45 at the Masters World Championships in Poland in 2015. As I was approaching 50 I decided to target a new challenge and became a decathlete. I had to learn a whole new set of endurance

disciplines including 400 and 1500 metres races, hurdles, the javelin, pole vault, shot put, long jump, high jump and discus.

"My plan was to use the decathlon not only as a fresh challenge but as a means to keep me fit and keep me going until I could move into the new Masters category once I turned 50. I've now started my autumn and winter training schedule and my goal is to break that M50 200 metres world record next year and hold three consecutive world records."

Darren, who has been made an honorary member of his local athletics' club St Helens Sutton in recognition of his amazing achievements on the track, is due to compete at the Sale Harriers Open Meeting at Sport City in Manchester just three days after his 50th birthday, and could go for the record then.

Says Darren: "At the moment I'm running in the 60 metres as there is no M50 200 metres race on the Sale Harriers event schedule – but I intend to talk to the organisers to ask if they will stage a special race so I can go for the world record in Manchester. Failing that, the Masters World Athletics Championships are being held in Poland from March 24 to March 30, and it would be wonderful to clinch the record there. I've already booked my flights and I can't wait for the 2019 season to begin.

"I love running and I love competition. I'll soon be 50 but I am as hungry as ever to win medals and break records. There's something for everyone in Masters Athletics no matter how old you are. People can take part as long as they are fit and able, and the Masters' events show there is no age barrier in athletics. I've seen a 75-year-old pole vaulting and a 100-year-old competitor taking part at one championship!"
